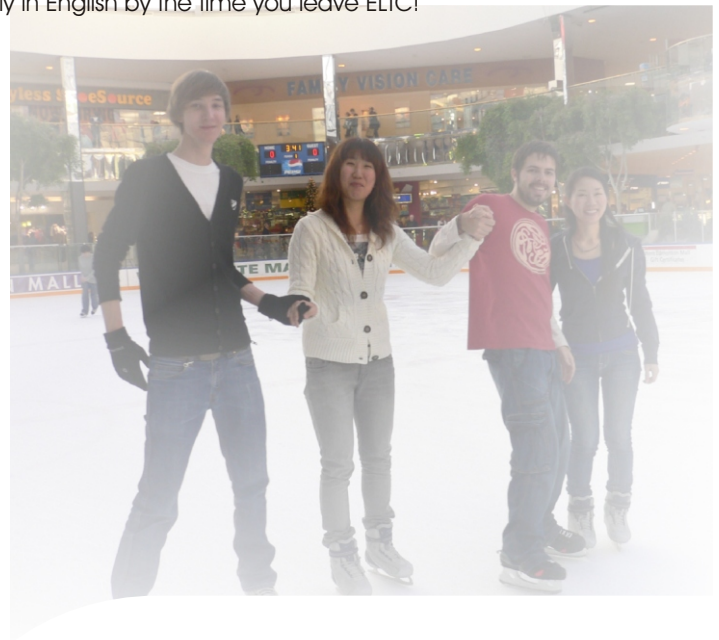
# Speak English

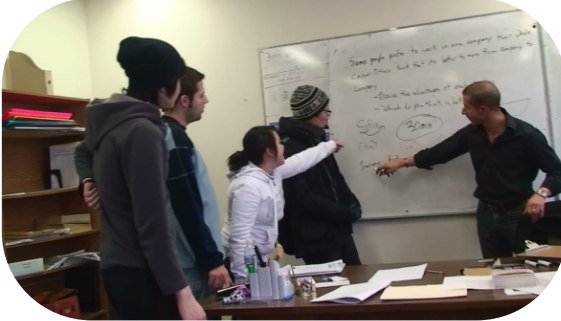

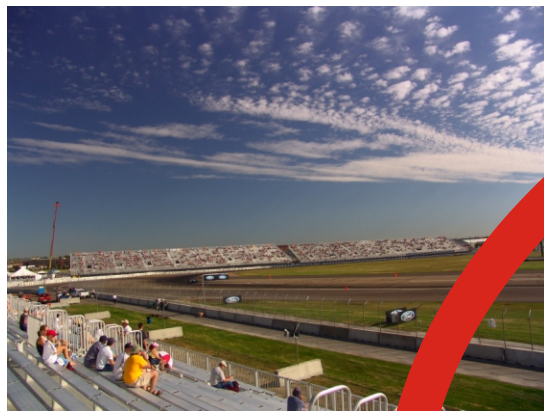

**Edmonton is the Festival City. During summer we have a festival or festivals every weekend!**

The North Saskatchewan River Valley has the longest expanse of urban parkland in North America, with over 7,400 hectares of sights, golf courses, nature trails, attractions, and 97 kilometres of multi-use trails for cycling, jogging or just a stroll.

Edmonton is situated on Via Rail's 'The Canadian Route', which travels from Toronto to Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Jasper and Vancouver.

Edmonton International Fringe Theatre Festival hosts over 1200 performances of 140 productions on thirty stages in the parks and on the streets, with 1000 performing artists from Canada and around the world. It is regarded as the largest alternative theatre festival in North America.

The annual winter event, 'Bright Nights' features Canada's largest drive through Christmas lights theme park. It contains over 475 animated and static Christmas displays, some over 25' tall.

Canadian Final Rodeo, season-ending competition of Canadian professional rodeo is the largest annual indoor sporting event in Western Canada.

**To apply to our College, you need to complete and send:**

1. the registration form
2. a copy of the first page of your passport
3. a copy of your visa, (if you have one)
4. a cheque for the amount of tuition, (or you can bank transfer the fee)

We will send you a *Letter of Acceptance* immediately.

We provide an airport pickup service by limousine for \$100 Canadian dollars (plus GST).

If you require an airport pickup service, please indicate (airport pickup) on your registration form and include \$100+GST with your tuition fee.

# About ELTC

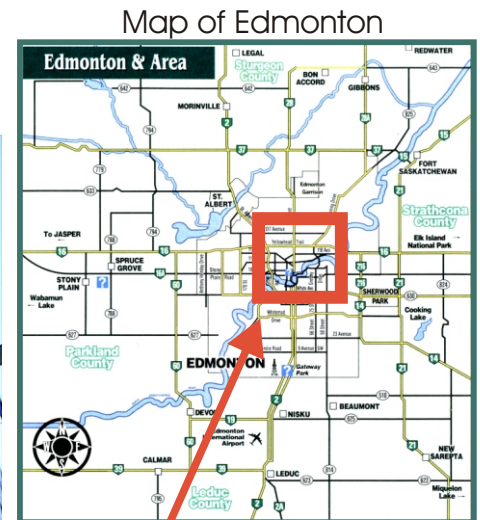
